
## **PSSO 2022 Concert Tour**



Prom June 18-27 Preucil School's most advanced orchestra, Preucil School String Orchestra (PSSO), traveled to Eastern Germany and the Czech Republic for their ninth overseas concert tour. Thirty-eight PSSO students, two percussionists and conductor Carey Bostian made up the orchestra in the group of 63. The itinerary included four concerts, guided tours of historic sites, and time to explore independently.



Following a half-day of touring in Berlin, including the Berlin Wall and the Holocaust Memorial, PSSO's opening concert in Kaiser Wilhelm Memorial Church drew an appreciative crowd. The audience was treated to the World premiere of a delightful piece written by PSSO's 15-year-old violist Jacob Newton, and the program's final piece, "Millionaire's Hoedown," with a specially written solo, received sustained applause.



After two days in Berlin, the group transferred to Leipzig via stops in Wittenberg, to tour the city where Luther posted his theses, and Halle, to visit Handel's birthplace. A morning tour in Leipzig took the group to the Bach Museum and the church where Bach was organist. In the evening, a long line of people streamed into Leipzig's Reformed Protestant Church when the doors opened for PSSO's second concert. The enthusiastic audience "demanded" an encore.




From Leipzig, the group traveled to Prague, stopping to tour Dresden, "the Florence of the Elbe," and Terezin in Chechia, a ghetto and prison camp that held Jews during WWII. Visiting on an especially hot day, the group got a sense of the suffering the Jews endured in extremely overcrowded conditions with poor sanitation and sparse food.

In Prague the group toured Old Town and dropped off books for Ukrainian refugees in a moving exchange with students at an elementary school. PSSO's third concert at the Museum of Music played to another great audience, who asked for an encore.

## **Eastern Germany & the Czech Republic**

The following day, the group traveled out to Nelahozeves to tour the Lobkowicz family's Nelahozeves Castle. Staunch supporters of music, the family accumulated a large collection of original scores over three centuries. While the Communist government confiscated the Castle and other Lobkowicz properties in 1948, the properties were restored to the family in the 1990s. The Nelahozeves excursion also included a visit to Dvorak's birth house, and the church where Dvorak sang.







We will forever be grateful for the very generous endowment established by Herb and Janice Wilson in 1991, to offset the cost of student travel on overseas tours.
