### **POLICIES (UPDATED 8/1/18)**

The Velay Certificate Program is a grant program and we take the commitment to this program very seriously. More than four absences per year will result in being dropped from the program. Extenuating circumstances for illness will be evaluated by Lisa, Ramin, and Deb and we will do everything we can to help the student make up assignments and exams. Repeated weekly absences for musical events or sports will count towards the yearly four absences.

Two times late equals one absence.

If you plan to miss a class, please leave a message for your instructors or send them each an email. It is your responsibility to get notes from a classmate when you miss a class. Assignments must be completed for all missed classes. All exams must be made up within seven days of the exam date.

We expect that all students make their best attempt to turn assignments in on time. If the first deadline is missed, students have one additional week to turn in the assignment without being penalized. If the assignment is not turned in within two weeks from its original due date, then a 5% deduction will be taken. An additional 5% deduction will be taken for each week that an assignment remains outstanding. Please note that there will be opportunities to earn extra credit points during the semester. Students must maintain an 88% average for the two-year program in order to receive recognition for the Certificate Program at graduation. Students may remain in the program with a 75% average, but will not receive recognition at graduation.
