Dear Preucil Parents & Families:

Thank you for participating in the **49th Annual String Concert at Hancher Auditorium on Sunday, February 2 at 2:00 p.m.** This year's concert celebrates the school's 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary and holds a few surprises! We are excited to say "thank you" to our families and community who have supported us over the years, and we look forward to seeing you. The concert is free and open to the public. The main doors to the Hancher lobby will open at 12:00 p.m. The Auditorium will open at approximately 1:30 p.m. for seating and we hope you will stop by the reception as you leave. This concert is an important part of our curriculum and is an important learning experience for those who participate. We embrace this unique opportunity to share our music and represent Suzuki training in our community!

**REMINDER:** All students who are taking part in the **ANNUAL STRING CONCERT**, including those who are **not members of a group class**, have received information from your teachers and are required to attend group classes as scheduled leading up to the concert. ***Please refer to the following pages for Dress Rehearsal and Concert Day schedules for your instrument and level.***

All students and parents participating in the concert, need to review the information in this **Bulletin**. This is very important as we will be following a new concert format this year, different from past years. The information is arranged by instrument. Please note the instrument in the top left corner of the page. Your cooperation in attending all scheduled rehearsals for your group, arriving when indicated, and reviewing concert music carefully will help ensure a memorable concert.

### **Student Experience & Audience Etiquette and Manners**

Preucil School of Music strives to create a professional performance opportunity at the Annual String Concert at Hancher Auditorium for participating students as part of their learning curriculum. Please be respectful of the students performing and fellow patrons by adhering to the guidelines for attending a professional music performance.

- The concert will **start promptly at 2:00 p.m.** Family members and guests should be prompt, as late seating will only take place between pieces. The concert ends at approximately **4:45 p.m.**
- If you have a **young child who is restless**, please take them out to the lobby where Hancher staff can direct you to the quiet rooms.
- Please note the auditorium has **two cry rooms** in the back of the auditorium's orchestra level with seating and sound.
- **Re-entry to the Auditorium** will only be done in between pieces during applause.
- Please be respectful of the performing students and fellow patrons by **remaining quietly** in your seats during the performances.
- When **choosing your seats** as you enter the Auditorium, please do not leave extra seats between you and the next person. We want to have plenty of space for everyone to sit without having to separate family members into single seats.
- Please **do NOT use any perfume or aftershave** at any Preucil School event. We have several students and adults with allergies to perfumes and aftershaves.
- **Video recording and photographing the concert is strictly prohibited.** The concert will be professionally video recorded and photographed. Video of the concert will be available on YouTube and professionally taken photos will be made available for free after the concert.

## FAQs for Parents:

- 1. What is the Annual String Concert Bulletin?** It is a document giving important information about “Everything Hancher.” Please read the Table of Contents, find your instrument, turn to the page and you will find schedules for rehearsals and the concert day. The Bulletin also contains general concert information, a Hancher map, and a schedule of activities for the various programs post-Hancher.
- 2. What is a dress rehearsal?** A run-through of the concert pieces. Important performance details and general information are covered. Attendance is required.
- 3. What does my student wear to the dress rehearsal?** Normal school attire.
- 4. Where does my student enter Hancher?** Use Entrance 3 on the west side of the building (Strauss Lobby entrance). It is located by the handicap parking on the west side of the building. See the map on pages 13-14.
- 5. Who plays in the first half?** Espressivo Strings; Pretwinkle Violins and Pretwinkle Cellos; Violas; Violins.
- 6. Who plays in the second half?** Flutes, Basses, Cello Choir, Cellos and PSSO (Philharmonia & Sinfonietta).
- 7. What is Pretwinkle?** Our youngest Violin and Cello students who do not yet play Twinkle and Variations up to tempo. They play open strings, some fingers, Pop Goes the Weasel and are setting their musical foundation.
- 8. What is PSSO?** The school’s most advanced orchestra is made up of Sinfonietta and Philharmonia. It stands for Preucil School String Orchestra.
- 9. What is Espressivo Strings?** The school’s most advanced violin performing ensemble was founded by Doris Preucil and is conducted today by Lisa Guttenberg.
- 10. What does my student wear for the performance?** Espressivo Strings and PSSO wear their Espressivo and PSSO attire. Pretwinkle and beyond: black and white. White blouse or white long-sleeved shirt and black skirt or black dress pants. Please, no leggings or miniskirts. See pages 11 & 12.
- 11. Can I video and/or take photographs in the Auditorium?** No. See page 2.
- 12. Can we leave after my student performs?** No. All performers are expected to remain for the entire concert. Experiencing the concert from an audience member’s perspective is part of the student’s learning curriculum. (Exception: Pretwinkle students may leave at intermission.)
- 13. Who do I contact to volunteer for the dress rehearsals or on Concert Day?** If you did not sign up during online registration to volunteer, please contact Jenna Battleson at 319.337.4156 or [jbattleson@preucil.org](mailto:jbattleson@preucil.org). Those parents who signed up at registration for Hancher as their volunteer activity will be contacted soon.

# VIOLINS

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## Violin Dress Rehearsals

**Expectations:** All **Violin** students (except **Pretwinkle**) are expected to attend.

**Monday, January 27**

**4:30-5:30 p.m. Espressivo, Concert & PSSO Violin** students from Monday rehearsals (No Thursday, Friday, or Pretwinkle classes) will meet at **North Campus in Walder Hall**. Please arrive by **4:15 for tuning**.

**Friday, January 31** (*Friday orchestras will NOT meet.*)

**4:30-6:15 p.m.** All **Violin** students (except **Pretwinkle**) meet at **North Campus**. Please arrive no later than **4:15 pm for tuning**.

1. **Espressivo, ROMANCE Violins** enter in the *Lower Level*, unpack and tune in the *Schubert Room*. You will remain in the *Schubert Room* until the faculty leads you to *Walder Hall*.
2. **All other Violins** enter on the *Upper Level*, unpack and tune in *Studios A, B, C, E & F*.

### **Dress Rehearsal Format:**

At your last lesson prior to the January 31 rehearsal, your teacher will give you a **name tag** naming your Entry Piece. ***Please wear this to rehearsal and sit according to the piece listed.***

We have structured the **Violin** Rehearsal to start with Twinkle and go backwards through the concert. Once a piece has been rehearsed, the students for which that will be their first piece will be released. (Example: If your child will enter the concert on **Folk Song Medley**, at the rehearsal they will play **Twinkle**, then **Folk Song Medley**, and then will be released to go home.)

***Parents of young students, please plan on staying at the school to help your students unpack and repack as soon as they are done.***



*Special note to parents: The space will be limited for parents to watch the rehearsal in Walder Hall. If you want to VOLUNTEER to help with crowd control, there will be a chair for you. (Contact Jenna Battleson at 337-4156 or [jbattleson@preucil.org](mailto:jbattleson@preucil.org) to volunteer.) Otherwise, you may watch from the window in the faculty lounge, or from the doorways.*

**Note: No group classes on Thursday, January 30 and no orchestras on Friday, January 31. Friday, January 31 is the violin & viola dress rehearsal (4:30-6:15).**

1:15 p.m. **Pretwinkle Cello** students arrive **PROMPTLY** and report to *Room 1306*. **YOU PERFORM 2<sup>nd</sup> ON THE CONCERT!** Please use *Entrance 3* on the west side of the building.  
1:30 p.m. **Cello** students not in PSSO orchestra, i.e., *Twinkle and beyond*, arrive **PROMPTLY** and report to *Strauss Hall*. Use *Entrance 3* on the west side of the building.

1. Put your instrument on the spot that corresponds with your position in the cello ensemble. (Number to be assigned at dress rehearsal).
2. Go to the *Auditorium* with your family to listen to the 1<sup>st</sup> half of the concert.
3. At intermission, report to *Strauss Hall*. Cellos perform in the 2<sup>nd</sup> half.
4. After performing, return to *Strauss Hall*, pack up your cello and join the audience for the rest of the concert. You may leave your cello (in its case) in *Strauss Hall* until the concert ends.

12:25-1 p.m.      **PSSO Rehearsal** - Following rehearsal, all basses return to *Strauss Hall*. Leave basses and join families in audience for the 1<sup>st</sup> half. Report back at intermission. Basses are 2<sup>nd</sup> in the 2<sup>nd</sup> half and PSSO is the finale.

### **Basses not in PSSO orchestra:**

- Leave Basses in *Strauss Hall*, go home to get ready, and return at 1:50 for concert.
- At intermission, report to *Strauss Hall* for tuning/lining up.
- Following the Bass performance, return to *Strauss Hall* to pack up. You may leave your bass in its case in *Strauss Hall* until the concert ends. Please rejoin the audience.
- PSSO Basses – wait in *Strauss Hall*. PSSO is the finale.

## Concert Dress Guidelines and Shopping Sites

The school would like to help parents as they shop to find the appropriate concert dress for their student. Concert dress for everyone except PSSO and Espresso Strings is as follows:

- White, long-sleeved blouse with a collar, tucked in
- Black below-the-knee skirts (at-the-knee is fine for the youngest students) or black slacks
- Black closed-toe dress shoes/no high heels – maximum height 1.5 -2”
- Black tights, black hose (plain, no design) or white socks above the ankle for the youngest
- Black dress pants
- White long-sleeve shirt with normal collar or mandarin collar
- Black belt
- Black dress shoes
- Black socks

### The following attire does not meet concert dress standards:

Mini-skirts, tight skirts, skirts that have a slit down the side or front, jumpers, polka dots, glitter, red shoes, large hair bows, black leggings that double for slacks, capris, sheer white blouses with a camisole underneath, off-white tops, short sleeves or sleeveless tops, untucked blouse. Off-white shirt, short sleeves, long sleeves rolled up, untucked shirt, black sports pants, tennis shoes (unless all black), sandals.

On the next page, you will find information to help shop easily for your student when the time comes. We hope to eventually eliminate issues of dress, such as color of white, length of sleeve, to tuck or not to tuck, length of skirt, etc., by providing you with these clothing sites and concert dress guidelines. If you already have clothes that meet the concert dress guidelines, please feel free to use them. If not, don't spend precious time shopping when you can order directly online from one of the following sources.

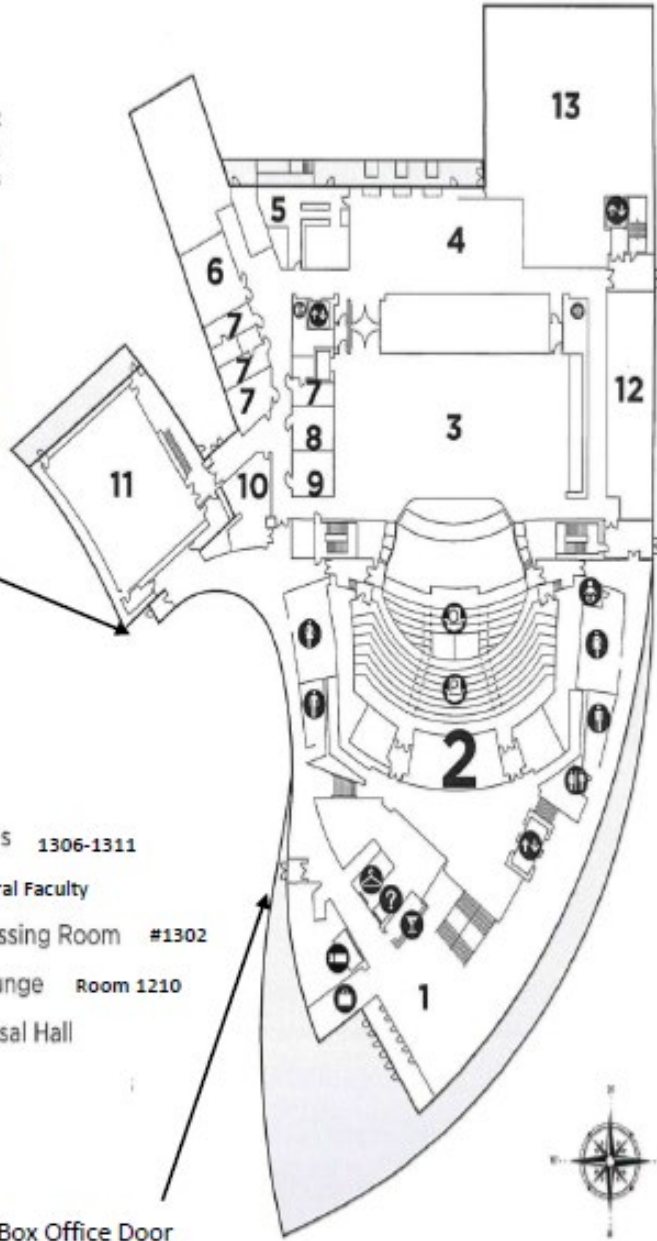
Student Entrance – Strauss Hall door #3

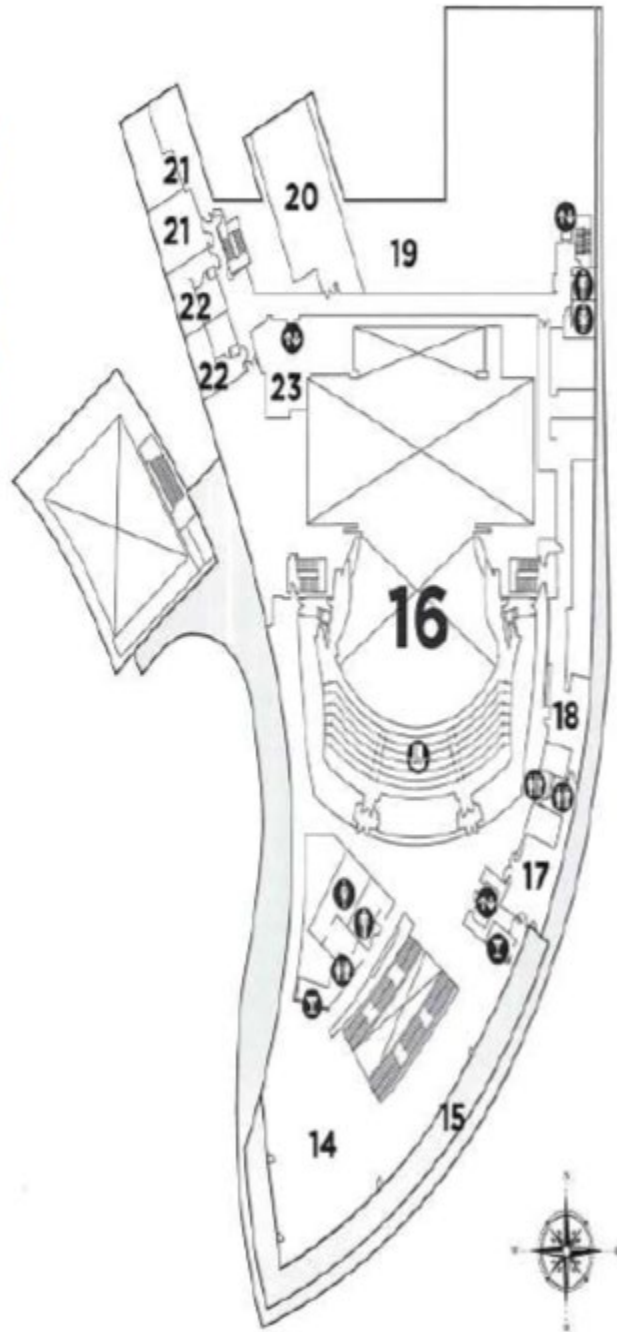
