



## In Memory of Dr. Joseph Walder

On March 26, 2024, friend and devoted supporter of Preucil School, Dr. Joseph Walder, passed away at the age of 73. Dr. Walder was a former biochemistry professor at the University of Iowa, founder of IDT (Integrated DNA Technologies), and philanthropist.

The Walder family joined Preucil School of Music in 1993, when daughter, Kathryn, began to study piano with Lauree Christman and later violin with Sonja Zeithamel. In 2004, Dr. Walder, through his company IDT, donated \$250,000 towards the construction of the rehearsal hall at North Campus, which is named Walder Hall.
